

6.

Improving the Implementation Machinery and Delivery System

In the Ninth Malaysia Plan, timely and effective implementation of projects will be the order of the day. As such, it is vital that we have an implementation plan, as well as monitoring, auditing and reporting systems to ensure all projects and programmes meet their stated objectives and are implemented on schedule in accordance with the necessary mechanism and procedures.

Developing Human Capital and R&D Capability

To raise the standard for our human capital and our Research and Development (R&D) capability. Human capital is a vital and most important asset, both for the Nation as well as for the State. We must therefore intensify our efforts in raising the individual capabilities for our people so that they can become knowledge and skilled workers who can work locally as well as anywhere in the world.

5.

Enhancing the Quality of Life

All our efforts in bringing development to the State have the purpose of raising the quality of life of our people. In this context, we keep on pushing our efforts to complete our coverage of treated water supply, electricity supply, better educational facilities and public health services to our rural communities.

2.

Speeding Up Growth in Rural Areas

The vastness of the rural areas of the State, where the future potential of the Sarawak economy lies, represents great opportunities available for us to develop the State. The rural areas are naturally our development focus to quickly spread the benefits of development to our people as well as to bring about renewed growth in traditional sectors. We must speed up the growth of the rural areas through specific development plans and programmes.

4.

Engaging the Private Sector

To actively engage the private sector in the wider fields of economic activities. With our focus in developing our human capital and R&D capability, it is logical that the private sector initiative would be required to be more involved in the State economy.

3.

Capitalising on Energy Resources

As a land with an exceptional variety of terrain and natural resources, we need also to learn to capitalize on the energy resources in the State so as to generate energy-based industries and make the State the powerhouse of the region.

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
