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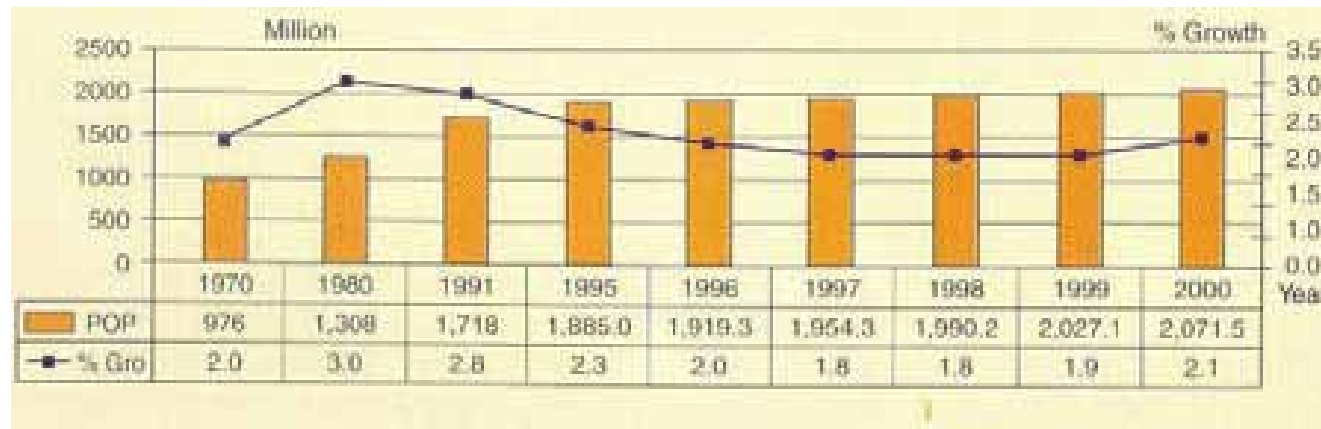

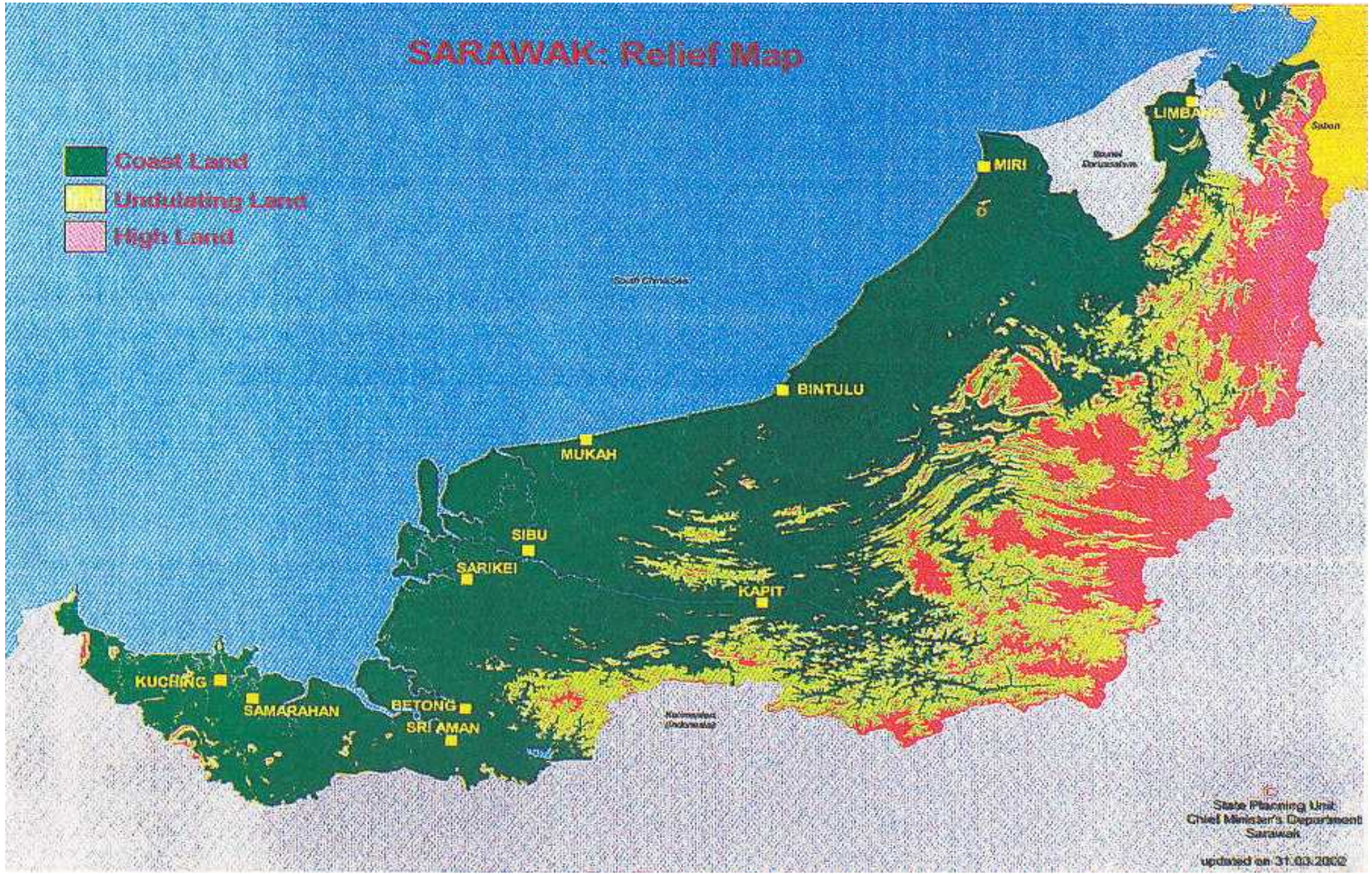

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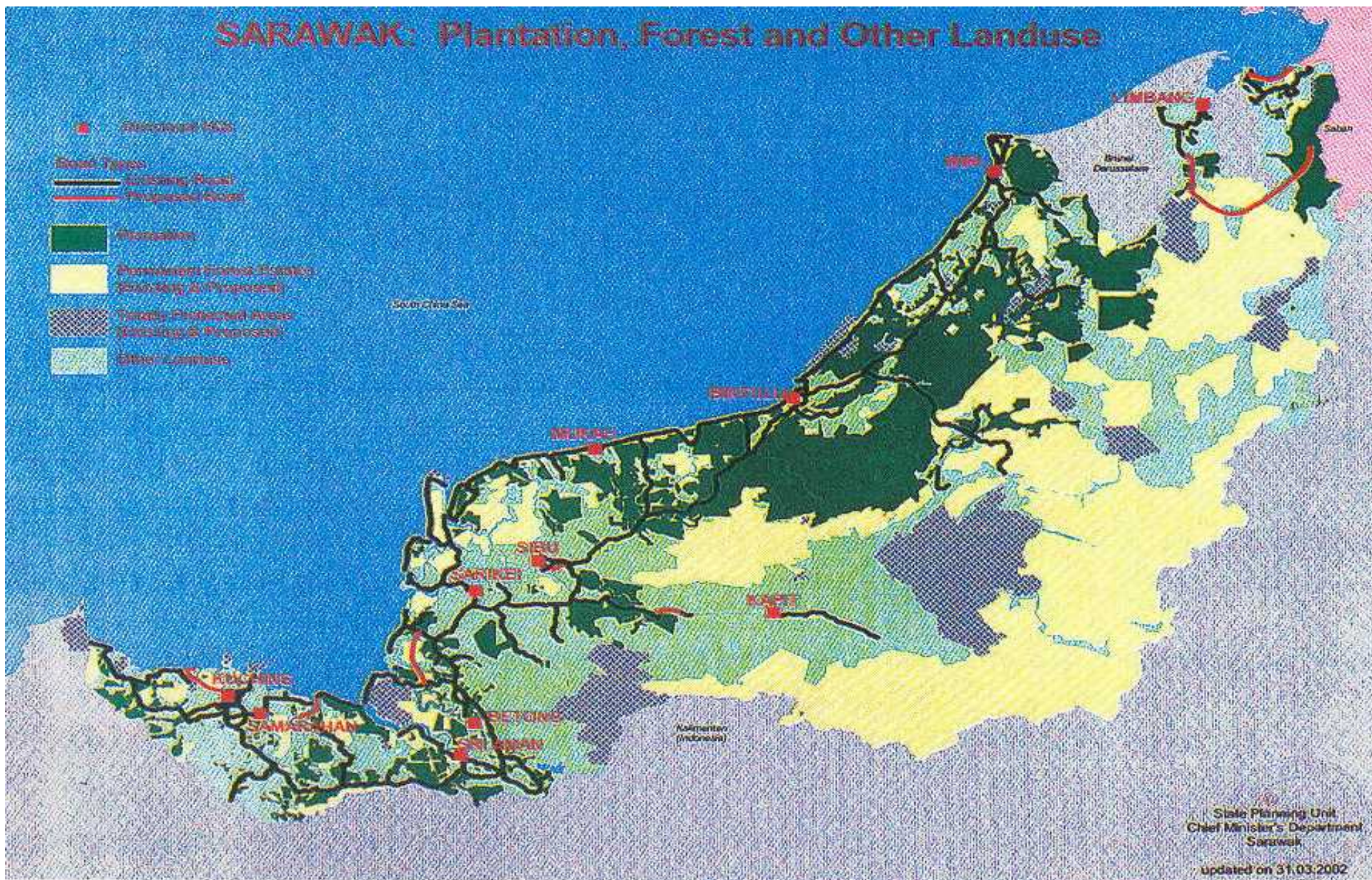

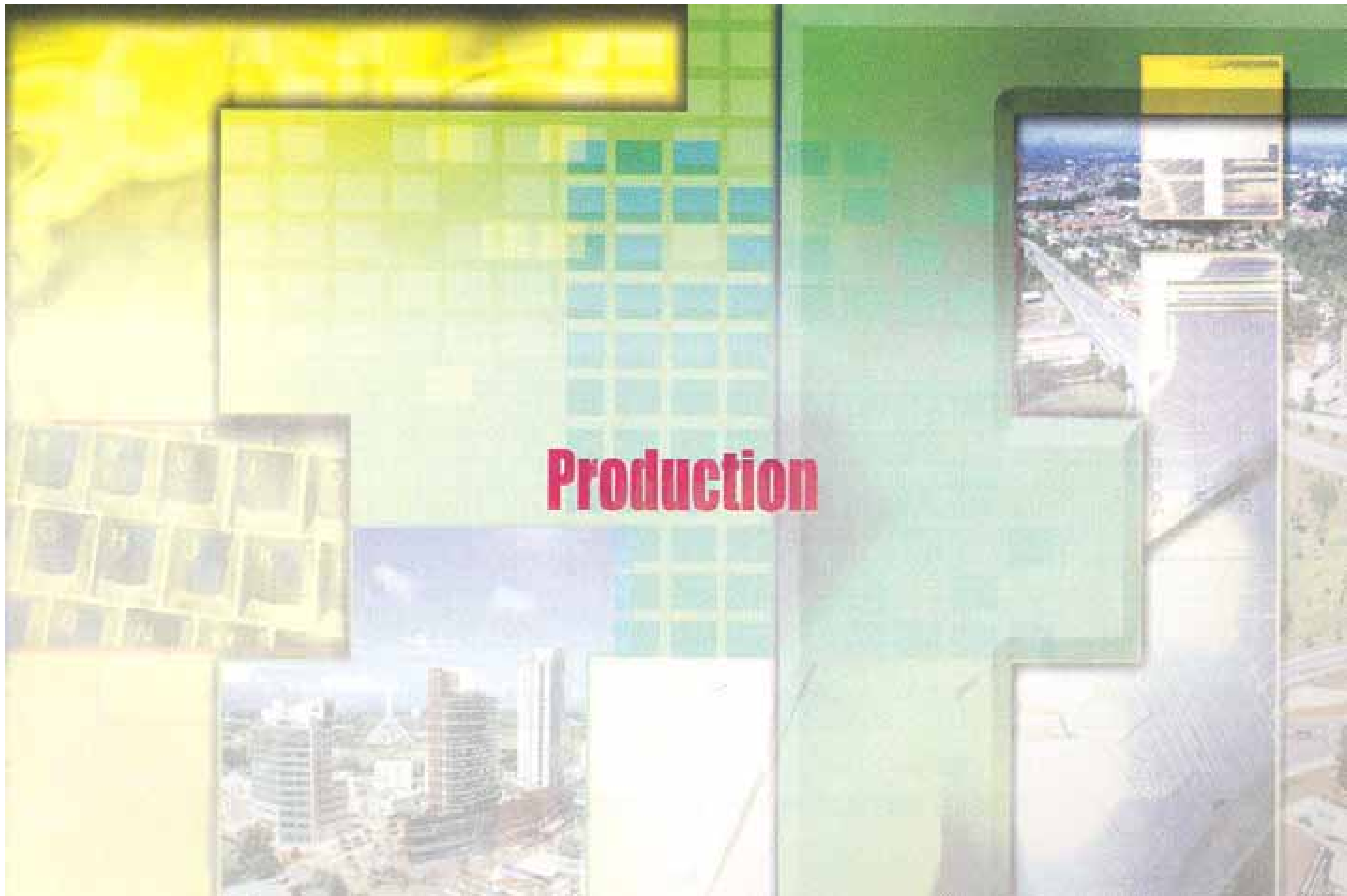

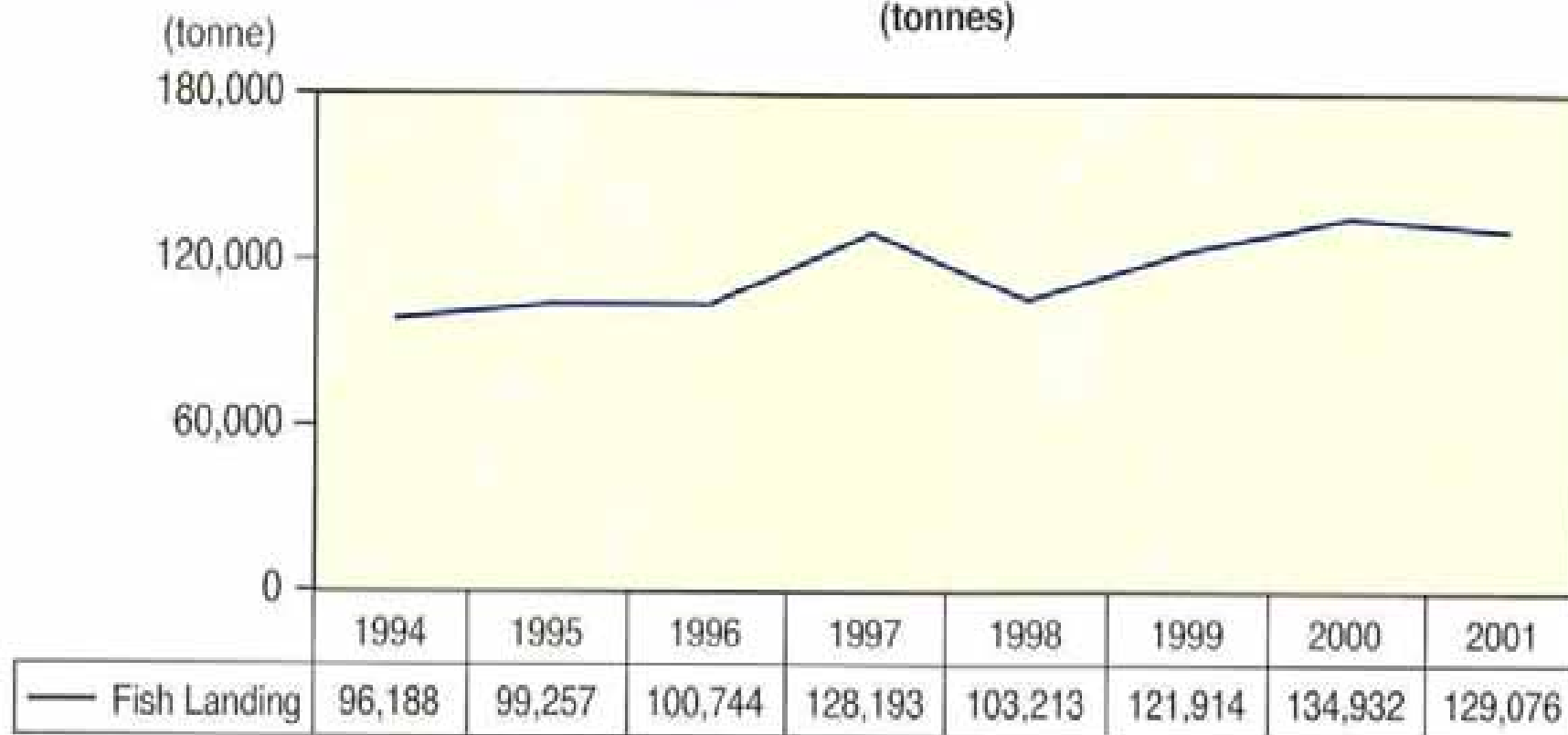

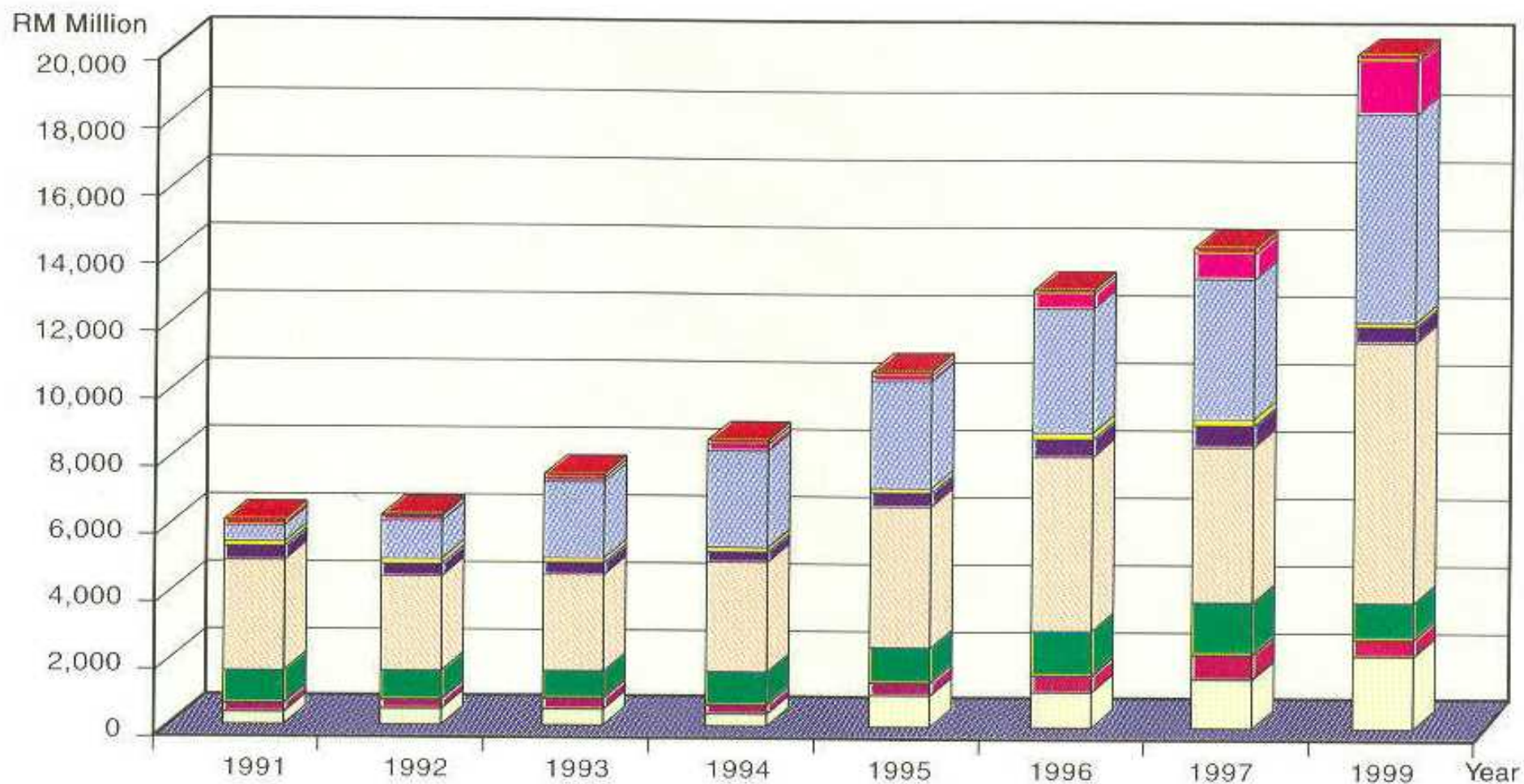

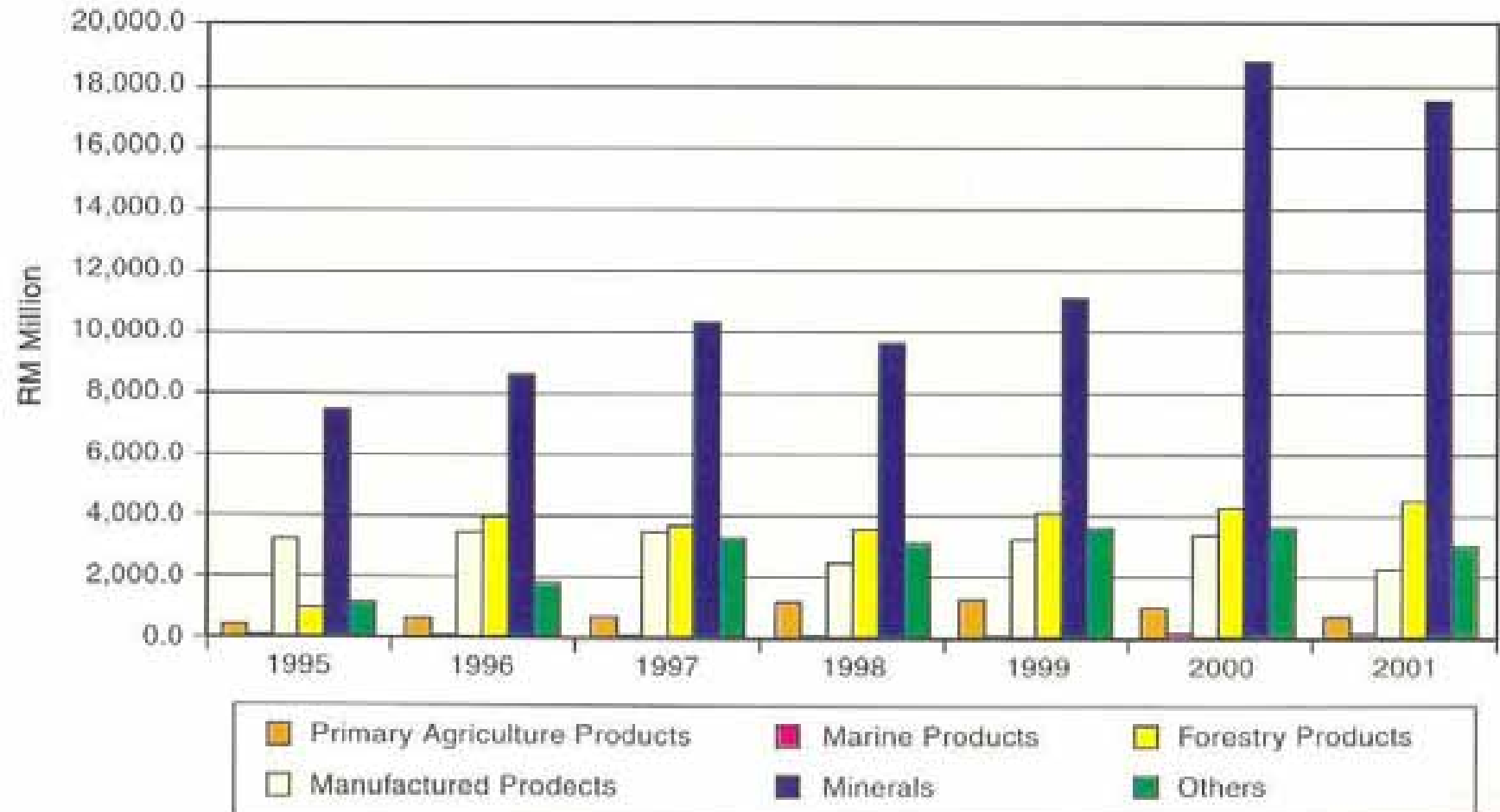

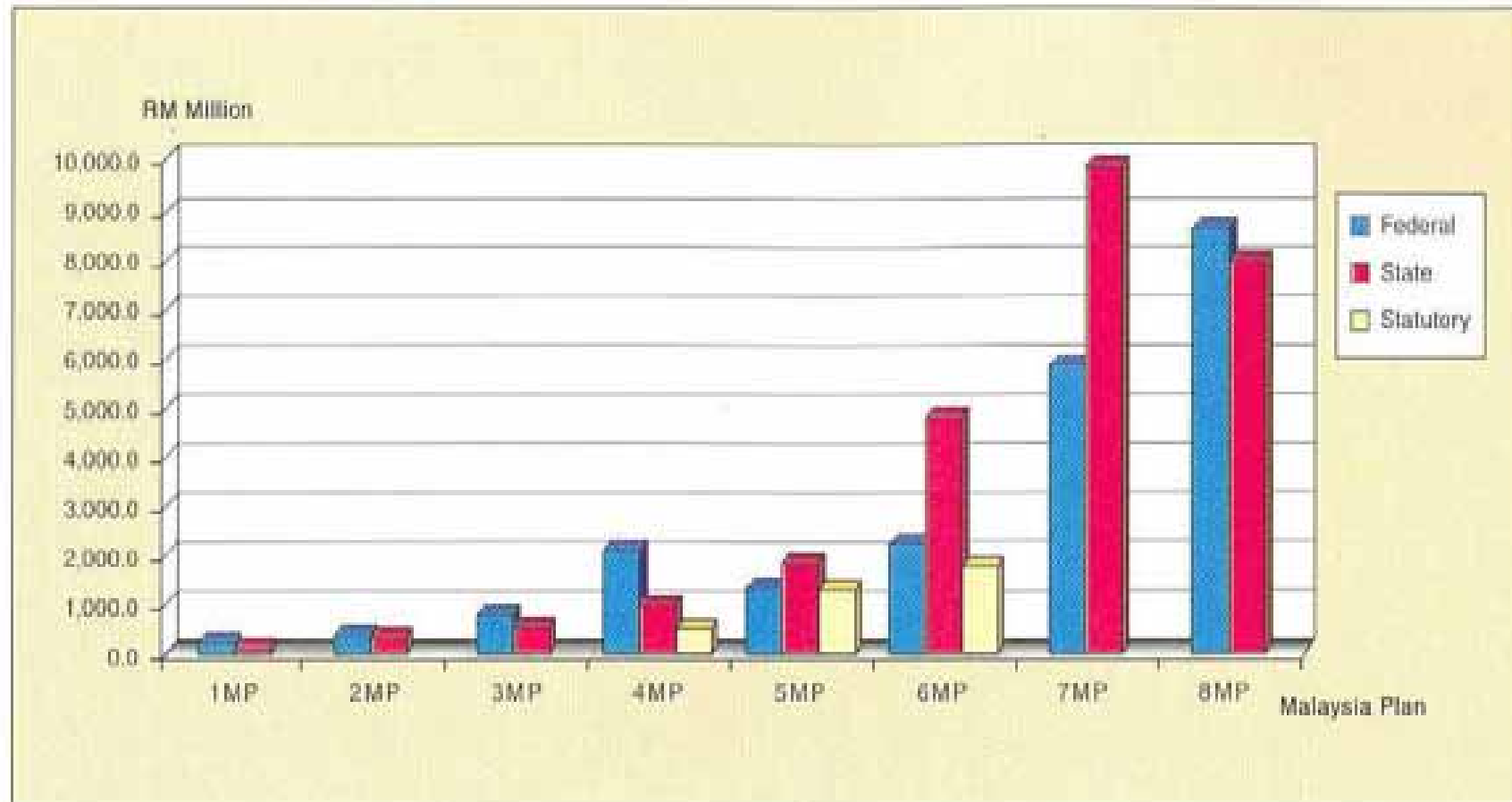

**New Reality** - The emergency of globalisation, IT and K-Economy calls for cognitive and attitudinal change to prepare the rakyat to face the challenges of: Change, Opportunities, Mobility, Equality.

**(iv) BROAD DEVELOPMENT VISION**

Sarawak will be a **fully developed and industrialized State by year 2020** with every one is having a share in an expanding economy. The goal is to create a more **progressive, prosperous, cultured** and **united** Sarawak.

### **B. KEY GROWTH SECTOR**

- . The State GDP is targeted to grow at 10% p.a. in 8MP to catch up with development at the National level.
- . The targeted per capita GDP at constant price (1981) is about RM10,377.5 and at current price is about RM18,520 for the year 2005

- The key sources of growth are: Manufacturing, Agriculture, Construction and Services (Tourism) Sector.
- **Manufacturing Sector** is targeted to grow at 17.5% p.a. Besides LNG as the main contributor, continued expansion of this sector will also be further intensified by investment in higher value added activities with emphasis on hi-tech and capital-intensive industries.
- **Agriculture Sector** is the second key sector that will generate the growth of the State economy. The sector is targeted to grow at 12.5% p.a. This growth will be spearheaded by modernization and commercialization of the agriculture sector **through plantation development (oil palm, forestry, sago, paddy), deep-sea fish-ing and aquaculture activities. Total targeted planted area of oil palm will be 700,000 ha by the end of year 2004, which will result in a cumulative area of about 1 million hectares cultivated with oil palm.**
- **Construction Sector** is targeted to grow at 10% p.a. Mega projects like Bakun Hydro Electric Project, Federal Administrative Centre at Rambungan and Infrastructure related projects like roads and bridges will undoubtedly enhance the performance of this sector.
- **Services Sector** is targeted to grow at 10.3% p.a. The growth impetus of services sector can be attributes to the **tourism industry**. Aggressive promotion on domestic tourism and long haul market will also induce the capacity expansion of tourism industry.

**(C) DEVELOPMENT STRATEGIES OF KEY GROWTH SECTOR IN 8MP**

**(i) INFRASTRUCTURE AND COMMUNICATION DEVELOPMENT**

- . Emphasis on the implementation of continuation projects and the upgrading of existing roads. Construction of new roads will take into account the economic potential of the affected areas. **The coastal highway** network will be the main focus of the 8MP.
- . Extension and upgrading of Kuching and Miri Airports and construction of new airports in Bintulu and Limbang.
- . Provide and expand other infrastructural facilities and services especially major ports, wharfs and jetties.
- . Provide more modern, efficient and high quality telecommunications services especially in rural areas and new industrial areas and township.

**(ii) MANUFACTURING**

- . Promote establishment of higher value added processing high-tech industries.
- . Promote foreign investment in Technology Intensive Industry.



# SARAWAK: Transportation Infrastructure



- . Develop more industrial estates in less developed areas with economic potential to disperse industrial development.
- . The development of industrial corridor will facilitate and enhance inter and intra industry linkages in the State.
- . Promote SMIs through the construction of factories in designated areas.

**(iii) COMMERCIAL AGRICULTURE AND LAND DEVELOPMENT**

- . Promote private sector participation in commercial land development / agriculture.
- . Promote spatial development through implementation of Integrated Development Programs (IADP), Regional Growth Centre (RGCs) and Regional Development Authority (RDA) Concept.
- . Intensify the development of other activities like deep-sea fishing, aquaculture, inland fisheries and food industry.
- . Modernisation of agriculture and the rural sector.
- . Open up more land including Native Customary Land for commercial agriculture and land development particularly for oil palm. Development of other cash crops are also encouraged.

**(iv) TOURISM**

- . Marketing strategy will focus on culture, nature and adventure (CAN); Meeting, Incentive, Conference, Events (MICE) and consolidation existing markets as well as promoting new ones.

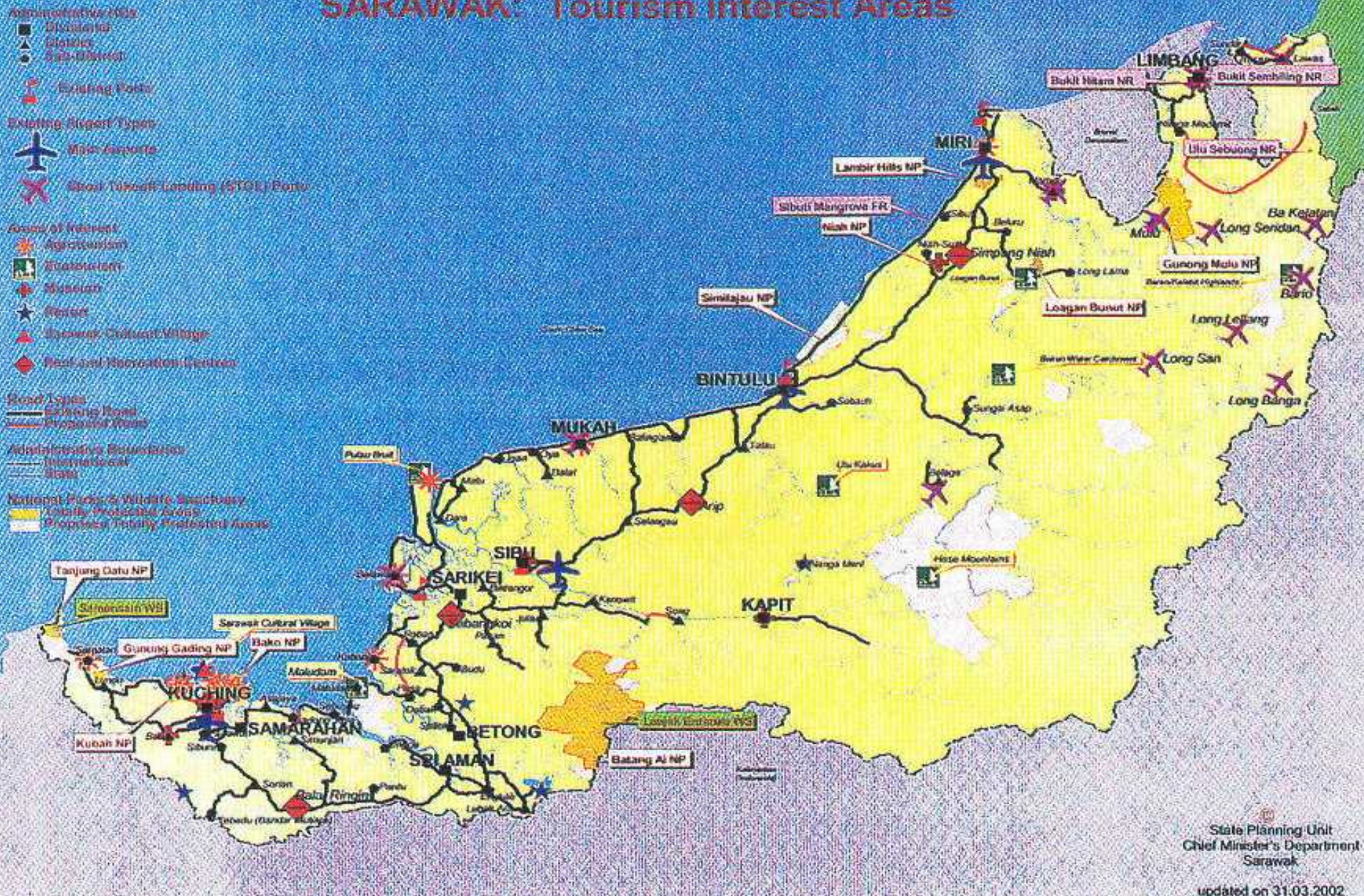
