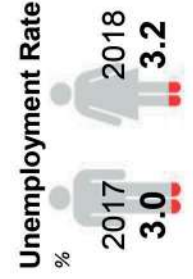

**RM1,361.5 billion**

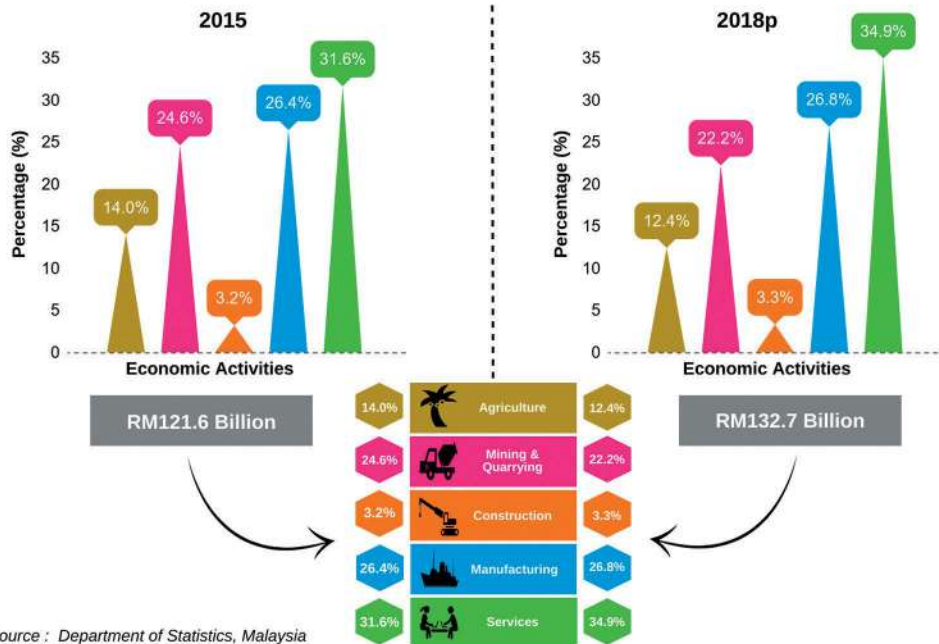

## Sarawak GDP Distribution by Economic Activities



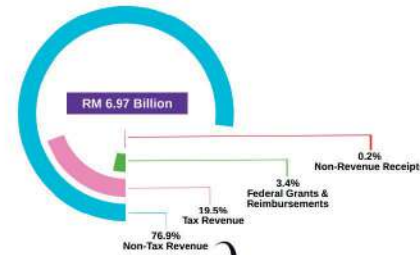

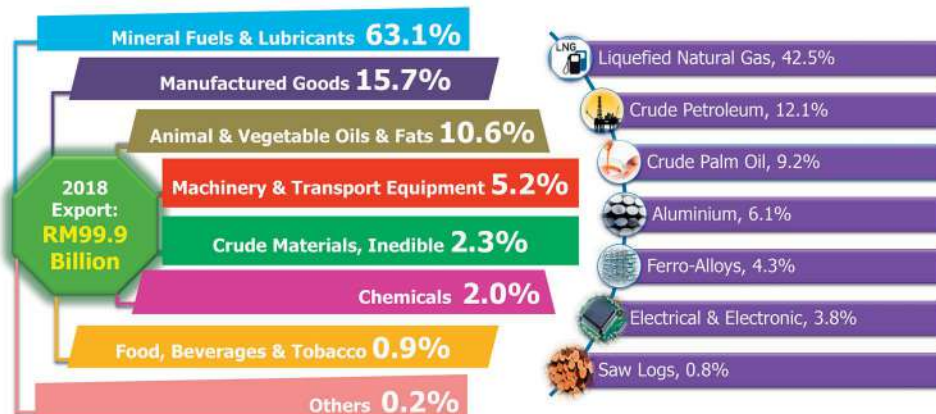

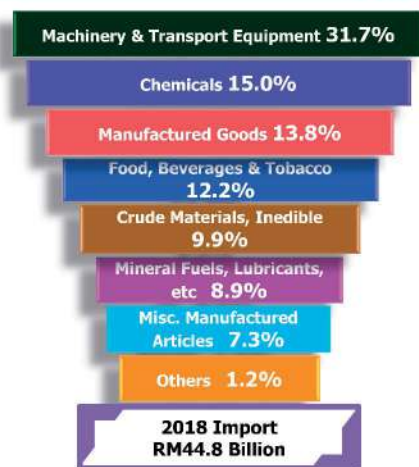


## Sarawak Export

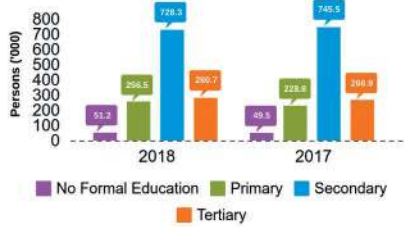

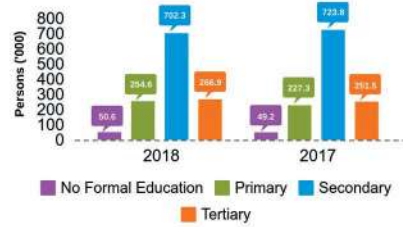

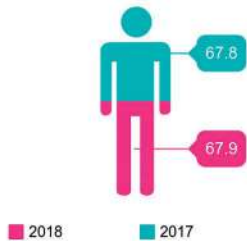
## Labour Force by Education Attainment



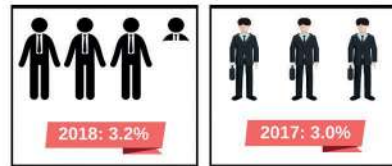
## Employed Persons by Education Attainment

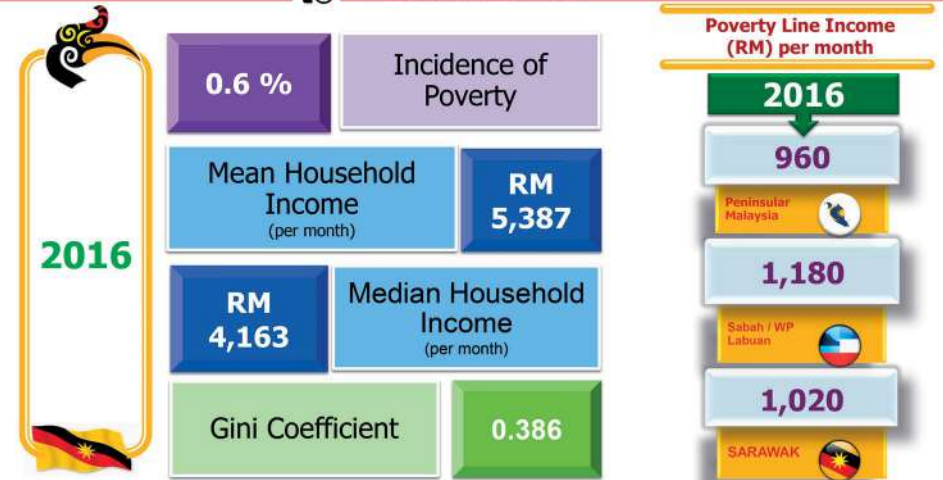

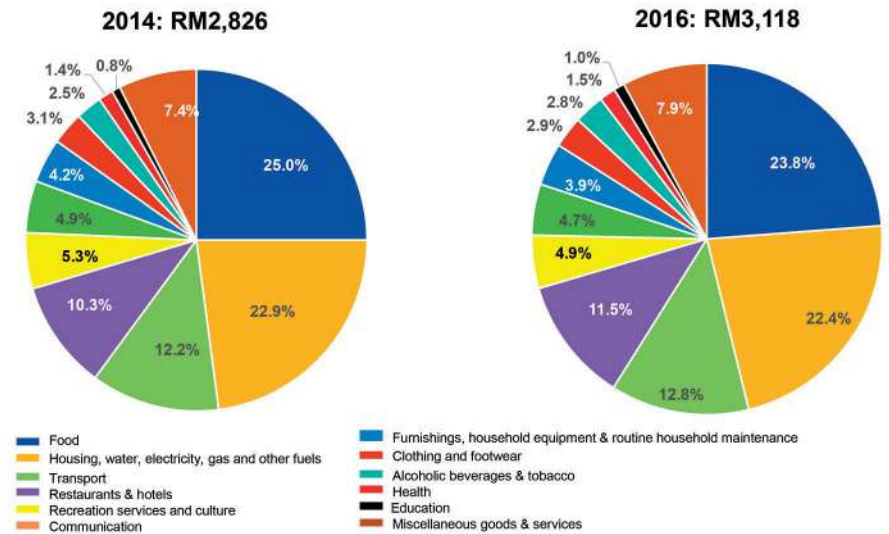

## Household Income

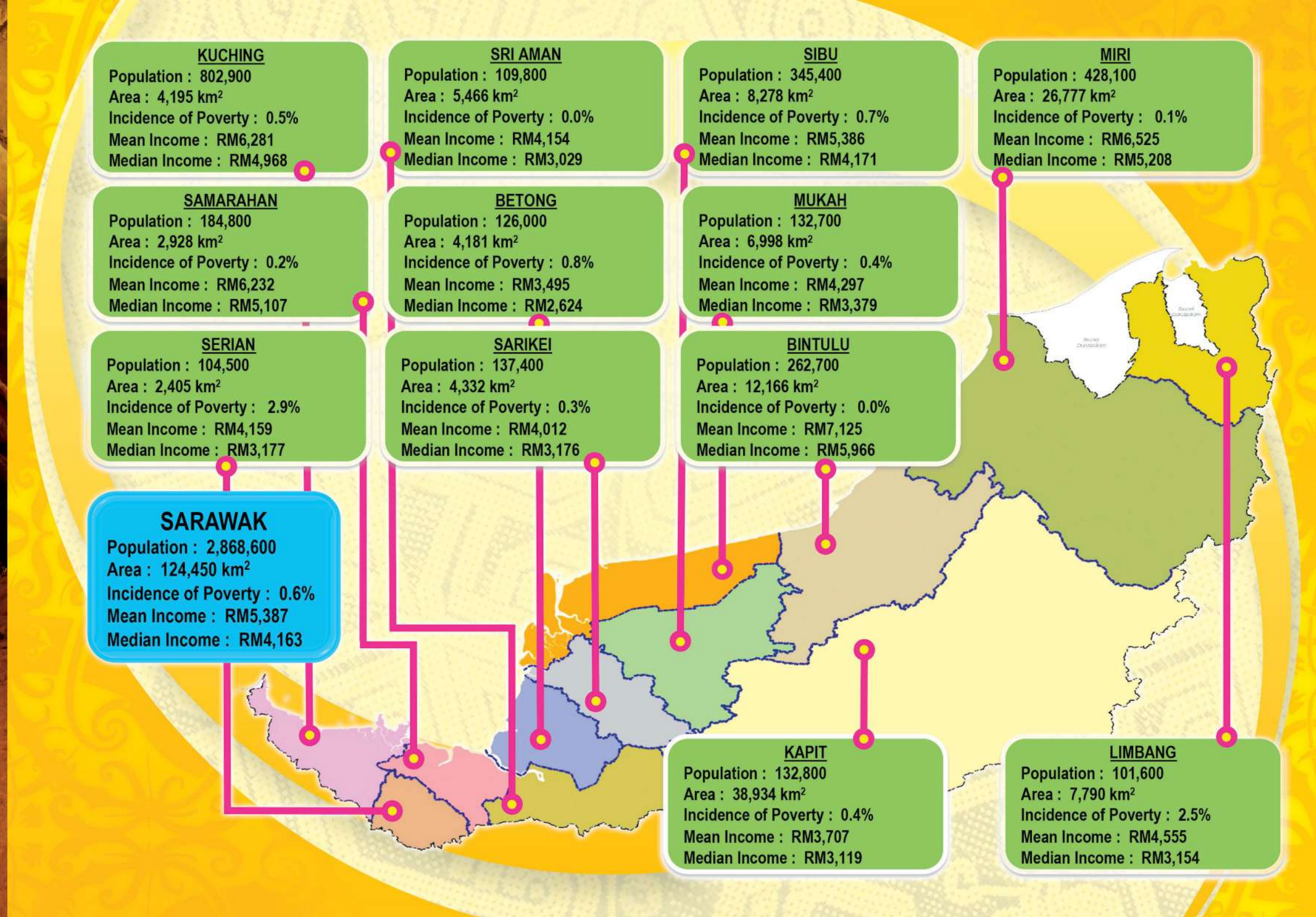
