

Notes

Forest:

Land spanning more than 0.5 hectares with trees higher than 5 meters and a canopy cover of more than 10 percent, or trees able to reach these thresholds in situ. It does not include land that is predominantly under agricultural or urban land use.

Forested:

Forested areas are derived from primary forests and areas that have been logged-over or harvested.

Secondary Forests:

Secondary forests refer to ecological systems deriving from clearing of natural forests for shifting cultivation. These are established after abandonment of 10 years or more by shifting cultivators.

Agriculture:

Lands in the State are planted with agricultural tree crops such as rubber, cocoa, coconut, oil palm, sago and non-tree crops like pepper and paddy.

Settlement:

Relating to towns and cities.

Water Bodies:

The water bodies refer to entire lakes, parts of lakes, parts of rivers and streams, estuaries, coastal waters or groundwater.




